The library

The Library holds a comprehensive range of materials relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and affairs, which can be accessed on-site. Please note this is a research library only: books and journals are not for loan.

History

The library was established around 1992 for the block mode students of the Koori Centre. Known as the Koori Centre Research Library, it started with a small collection of resources for the use of block mode students. The library has now grown to a library which hold a unique collection consisting of nearly 7000 items including rare and out of print materials.



Other services available include access to local and Indigenous newspapers (print copy), photocopy and printing and a quiet study area.

Collection

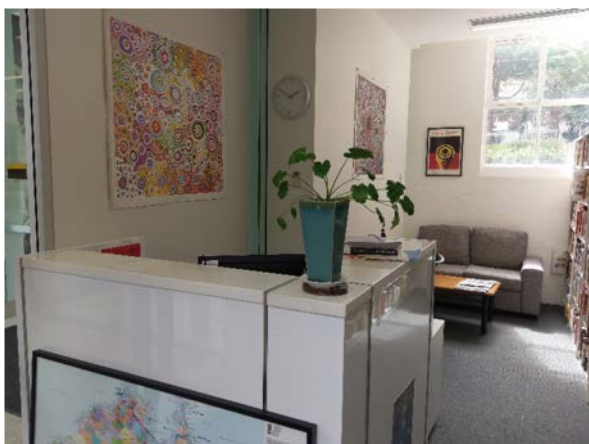
The library holds an extensive collection of:
